State budgets are under immense pressure, and the competition for fewer and fewer higher education dollars remains intense. The State of Virginia's financial contribution to VMI's yearly budget continues to decline. The price of tuition is at an all-time high and parents and students are only able to meet marginal increases. The only source with any flexibility is private/alumni donations.

Your donations provide the dollars that the Institute uses to bolster its academic program and support its faculty. As you all are aware, cadets will benefit from many academic opportunities and resources. In every department, faculty members who are leaders in their fields will present them with challenges to broaden their education and deepen their knowledge. Outside of the classroom, cadets experience presentations on relevant and significant issues, and they will also take advantage of the resources available from the Preston Library. These opportunities are available to cadets this year for the same reason they have been available in the past -- the generous support of the VMI alumni to VMI.

Recently, a few of us came together to begin the process of identifying how our class can seize this opportunity to lead and assist the Institute in meeting its financial needs today and tomorrow.

To that end, we are initiating a Class effort aimed at raising our collective participation and contributions to the Institute. It will begin now in conjunction with our 20th Reunion and grow over time so that we can assume our rightful place of class leadership among the Institute's senior alumni at our 25th Reunion in 2015.

The components of our plan are simple and are as follows:

• Class Participation
